About Hamilton Hills

Harford Road was built as early as 1791. The area was mostly farmland until the late 1800s. Hamilton Hills became a neighborhood in the early 1900s and was annexed by Baltimore City in 1918. It was named for Hamilton Caughey, who donated land for part of what is now Hamilton Avenue.

Hamilton Hills' current borders are: Perring Manor Road to the north, Echodale Avenue to the south, Perring Parkway to the west and Harford Road (Echodale to Glenmore), Old Harford Road (Glenmore to Moore), Moore Avenue (Old Harford to Perring Manor) to the east.
